

Haiti is experiencing some tougher times right now as political leaders fight for control. The people suffer with the closing of all public schools and business due to all the major roads being blocked. In Haiti it is common for rich political leaders to rent mobs to block streets with rocks and garbage and blame the unrest on the opposing party. Also, families who own major industries like gasoline use their product to also gain power and influence. Gas is over \$22 per gallon (ouch!!!!) and the Syrian family for example, who owns all distribution in Haiti will keep it high as long as they can to force the opposing political party to concede to their demands. Blackmail and corruption of full display. Pastor Wiljean has given us an update below:

Hello brother Brian and partners of THM - Greetings to you all,

We praise God for his presence in the situation difficult we are working in Haiti. The politicians locked all town, all commons areas, all roads with rocks blocking any cars any motorcycle cannot run in the streets and national road locked for all the cars.

They are kept doing that so that government moves out the palace about three weeks until now. This is very hard situation we are facing, all the stores closed and the people broke down so many stores (rices, beans, oil, ect).

How is Open door ministries responding to my country shutting down?

God gave me a good strategy for running the ministries inside the situation. All the churches keep working, all the activities keep going even in the situation. The harder situation, is gas. I spoke with pastors for services or worship without Gas (running generators to power sound systems), to use loud voice and to clap the hands for music. Church does not stop, we endure.

Seminary keep working now (65 students). *I asked students traveling to seminary passing around the barricades walking by feet to attend seminary.* (students traveling to the seminary take motorcycle taxis. When they approach a barricade, they get off, walk around barricades, rent a different motorcycle on the other side of the barricade, repeat process over and over and over).

My politicians as bad leaders released a leadership for locking country like that. Terrible.

Me as leader I released a leader for running ministries in the middle of difficulties as 2 Timothy 3:1–7 the last days the times will be difficult.


Thank you for praying for me and our leaders. Our ministry would like to keep plant church close to the people where there are.
