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Tradition

Jessica, a Mt. Holyoke junior psych major with no religious background whatsoever, spent Spring Break '14 with Cru as they evangelized the beaches of Panama City. The trip down, the inspirational talks, and the personal interaction with Cru & Epic students and staff all culminated in a moment of clarity for Jessica the final morning of Big Break. She took the rest of the day to ponder God's love, her brokenness, and Jesus' sacrifice. That night Jessica knew she had to take a leap of faith, despite her fears of believing in something she couldn't tangibly acknowledge. "Once it all soaked in, I felt pure relief, like I was onto a new chapter in life."

So how was it that Jessica decided to head south for a week of sharing the gospel when the gospel had yet to become real for her? Two years ago another Mt. Holyoke student, Jenny, took the Big Break challenge of listing and praying for 5 of her friends to come to Christ. Jessica was one of Jenny's five. Maybe that's why earlier this year Jessica started feeling like her life had no purpose. "Romantic relationships, academics, sports, friends - I began to realize that all the things I'd sought after were outrageously unstable. I went to Big Break searching for my purpose in life. I found it when I accepted God into my life."

It was five years ago when a Mt Holyoke student, Yejin, first took on this Big Break prayer challenge. Yejin's list included Olivia. Incredibly, Olivia also joined us to Big Break where she understood and accepted the gospel.

Will the tradition continue? Reading Jessica's story, I'm betting "yes." Summing up her Big Break experience, Jessica says, "I learned that God will guide me and work through me to spread His message." Whoever is on Jessica's Big Break list of five - watch out!



n Thursday March 20th, the last day of Big Break, I woke up early to discuss a story in the bible with three of my friends and just to reflect on the week. During that time, something clicked where I felt a glimpse of clarity in understanding those four spiritual truths. I remember saying, "I get it! I get it!" And that's when it hit me that I couldn't go back without accepting Christ into my life. I couldn't go back carrying all of the things that I learned and not doing anything with them. That life that I was living back on campus wasn't true living, it was suffering through it. Now realizing that this is what is going to give me meaning, that this is everything I've been looking for was amazing yet overwhelming and terrifying. I didn't grow up with religion in my family so having faith and believing in something that I wasn't able to tangibly acknowledge was frightening. But after thinking through it the rest of the day, confiding and conversing with friends, I knew that I had to just take that leap of faith. That night I accepted Jesus Christ into my life. There was a lot of crying and embracing and honestly I didn't know what to feel. Once I took a moment to soak it all in though, I felt pure relief, like a weight was lifted off of my shoulders, like I was onto a new chapter in life, that I was no longer in control, that God is now working through me.
