As part of the MTL (Missional Team Leader) track, I've had opportunities to hear from some seriously amazing speakers with incredible vision, experience, and knowledge. Their love for the Lord, humility, vulnerability, and faith flows from a life long commitment to lead others to the foot of the cross. Listening and reflecting on the many lessons, aimed at our hearts, heads and hands, I feel equipped and overwhelmed all at the same time. I am reminded anew of the honor, hope and weightiness of the call to make disciples which is upon every believer.

Jenny has been having an incredible time in her Christian Worldview and Christian Ethics classes, too. She's been wrestling with how to engage our post-secular culture with the gospel of Jesus Christ. From issues like the poor, LGBTQ, the sick, to philosophies like atheism, nihilism, and existentialism, Jen has been soaking it up and asking questions like "How do we intentionally weave meaningfully demonstrations and proclamations of the gospel into everything we do?"

We've been having some awesome discussions and "what if" sessions. As we gain a bigger and fuller vision of what God is calling us to, we look forward to seeing the Lord completing the wonderful work He's started at UMass and Western Mass. Of course it will take years of prayer and loving labor to see things come to pass, but we are seriously excited.

We are reminded that 7 years ago when we first arrived at UMass there were barely 12 students involved. But now there are as many as 120 students involved with our growing movements (Cru, Epic, AIA, Destino, etc) at UMass, Smith College, Mount Holyoke College, etc. While we've often rushed ahead of God's Spirit or lagged behind His leading, He has been moving with stately purpose and we stand in humble reverence of His Majesty. We are left asking what could happen in the next 7 years? What would we dare to trust God for together in His sovereignty and goodness? Some ideas that's surfaced in our "what if" discussions are:

- Faculty ministry We often hear horror stories of how many professors at secular universities are against God or Christianity. While this may be true, we know that God loves professors and they desperately need the gospel too. But not only this, in our recent conversations with some professors, we are sensing a deep hunger for spiritual things.
- LGBTQ ministry Most students from the LGBTQ community feel that God is inaccessible and unapproachable. Because of their orientation, they feel certain that a relationship with God is not an option. We want to see a safe space for students with questions about their sexual identity to encounter the gospel and experience a community of grace and truth.
- 100% Sent This summer as part of the National Staff Conference we heard from Dr. Gerry Breshear speak on the Biblical concept of "shalom" and "righteousness" and how these principles inform our calling as disciples and disciple makers. We want to see every student graduate with a sense of mission and calling for how they have been uniquely gifted to proclaim God's kingdom in word and deed.

In August, we'll be planning for the Fall semester. Please pray for us as we gather with staff and dozens of student leaders for a time of planning and coaching. One of our goals this year is to see more student leaders "own" the mission of reaching every student on campus.
