I mentioned to her the best way to help would be to form a new team where we could invite other players and focus on building a love for God and for teammates through the game of volleyball.

The challenges we prayed to God about were: get 10 players interested, find the right coaches who would challenge the players, and get a gym where we could have consistent gym space. In answered prayer, as you see below, we attracted 15 players, 3 new coaches, and a gym that we can use for the next four months. Recently, the new team gathered and everyone was so grateful, some openly praising God for how quickly everything came together. As we know, with God, nothing is impossible (Luke 1:37). God loves to give good gifts to His people e.g. a new volleyball team.

I am really fired UP to begin new life coaching, discipleship meetings with college students here in Nashville. Yesterday, I challenged a young man to a three month discipleship commitment where the goal is to help this young man grow spiritually, emotionally and physically. Another young man is a student at Morehouse University, who is a student athlete and plays for their new varsity volleyball team asks for some volleyball tips as he learns this new game.
