"No, I like being in control of my life." That's the response of most students I meet with. But not Nestor! He said, "Yes, I'd love to pray. I do want Christ in my life."

And so we prayed, "Dear God, I know I am not worthy to be accepted by you. I don't deserve your gift of eternal life. I'm quilty of rebelling against you and ignoring you. I need forgiveness. Thank you for sending your son to die for me that I might be forgiven. Thank you that he rose again to give me new life. Please forgive me and change me, that I can live with Jesus as my ruler. Amen."



I'm not sure if Nestor totally realized how significant the step he made was at that moment. But inside, I was jumping up and down (We were in a Starbucks, so I didn't actually jump up and down – it might have scared people). What a thrill to see the Lord change a quy's life right in front of me.

And it happened again an hour later with another freshman from BU named Frank. And it's been happening across the city. Nestor, John, the wrestling team captain who took him to church, and I have continued meeting the last few weeks to go over the basics - how you can have assurance of salvation, how you can experience forgiveness, how you can be filled with the Spirit, etc. We're praying that through Nestor and John, we can see the whole wrestling team hear the gospel.
