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Ministry Update

One of my first long term projects has reached completion. For the past few months I have been working on repackaging the Missiology Training. Missiology is a multi-disciplinary and cross-cultural reflection on all aspects of the proclamation of the Gospel. At School to the Nations we have a six-session course that covers the biblical, historical, and cultural perspectives of missions. Students going through the course will build a philosophy of missions beginning with God’s commands and building to the specifics of individual outreaches.

During the training students wrestle with the issues and struggles facing mission work around that world and they are challenged to be the innovators for the modern missions movement. This six-session course is coupled with our Kelunka Village Training to prepare students spiritually, mentally and physically for the journey ahead of them.

I eagerly step into a new season where I get to teach the material I have been designing over the past months. We have two teams that will begin the training this month and finish with mission trips this coming fall. I feel like a teacher on the first day of school waiting to see who will show up in my class!

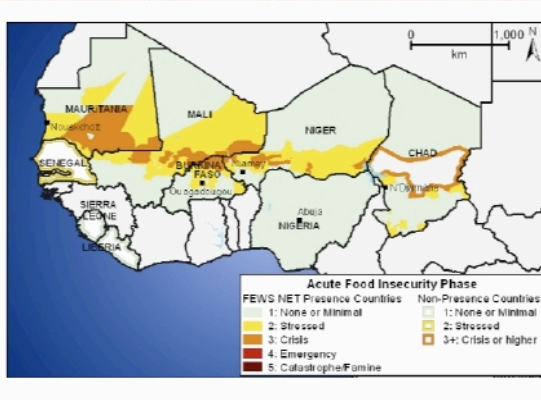

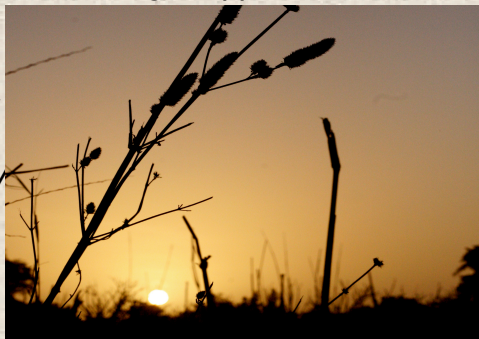
The brown area across Mali reflects the severe drought which has caused the "Acute Food Insecurity" shown on this graphic. Source: FEWS NET
