
International Day

SETTING SAIL

A few months ago, I shared a little about the vision trips we had on the horizon! Well the horizon seems to be quickly approaching. This December we will be headed to South East Asia to meet a new unreached people group. We will be going with a larger group and start out with a week of ministry in the city working with college students. This will give us time to adjust to the culture and settle in. Then, during the second week, a small group of our staff will travel to a more remote location and meet several unreached people groups.

"Some sat in darkness and in the shadow of death prisoners in affliction and in irons...He brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death and burst their bonds apart." Psalms 107:10;14 These people groups have lived in isolation from the gospel. They live in a mountainous region and are held by the bonds of animism and Buddhism. We are so excited for what the Lord will do during this time and for the long-term ministry that will be developed. We pray that the Lord would clearly reveal a creative access to allow us to work in and around these regions. Our loudest cry is that the Lord would begin to BURST bondage and push out the shadows and lies written on this people. We pray that He would mark them with His truth.

South East Asia, we begin to look at the sin that strangles these peoples and the freedom and promise the Lord desires to bring to this land. South East Asia has a beautiful culture, but they are plagued with opium addiction. This addiction removes their desire to eat or drink, completely alters their mental state, degrades their teeth and eventually leads to death. This is a work of the advisory to cloud their hearts and minds from their Creator. Pray that the Lord would free them from this bondage and provide jobs outside of the opium industry. Please pray that the Lord would direct us in ministry to South East Asia!

From my heart...

"Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good." – 1 Peter 2:2-3

Yesterday I sat in the park as a toddler "ran by". You know the kind of running where arms flail and each tiny stride takes all their might. Off balanced and unsteady, they charge ahead with an uncanny face of frustration and determination. It took me back to the days of watching my mama's hands form braids and stir hot chocolate, when all my fingers made were tangles and spills. I remember practicing for hours and then giving up hope that my hands would ever embody the grace and talent of my mother's.

Then I recalled that magical day where I neatly wove three strands of hair and I swirled a spoon with out a splatter. Physical coordination takes time. Muscles must strengthen, the brain must be trained and the body develops in such a way that the unachievable suddenly becomes natural. At age 4 I could not will my fingers to braid, regardless of my understanding, observation and practice. But at age 10, all of those observations and practice came to fruition as my physical capabilities caught up with my desires.

Perhaps we have a sense of spiritual coordination as well. Those moments where you want to act in a certain way, have knowledge, speak naturally out of the overflow of your heart, but all that comes out are flailing arms and frustration. Perhaps we need to fully accept God's grace through our growth and settle in for the process of sanctification. Perhaps it's not about over practice and working for perfection, but about feeding on all that is good and true and holy; feeding on Christ love and His word. Just like our tiny bodies, as we continually feed on good, sustaining, life-giving milk we may just walk into a beautiful stride.
