As I reflect on my time with School to the Nations, all of your faces and countless prayers come to mind. Throughout the last 7 years and especially the last 4 years each of you have been a part of this story and been obedient to the Lord's call to carry His name to the ends of the earth. Entering into support-raising was scary and at times overwhelming, but He has shown His faithfulness and His provision through the giving hearts of His people. It has been a joy to partner with you and I have learned a new level of commitment and sacrifice for the Gospel through your example. For some of you that has been financial, for others it was laboring on your knees and a few of you decided to get on a plane with me! In whatever way you have sacrificed through this last season, I pray you know what a great joy it was to co-labor with you and know that the Lord has done mighty things across the alobe with our small faith.
