It was a great encouragement to hear from those who have gone before us as we are called to move forward in the ministry and to keep pushing the boundaries of technology to reach people for Christ.

Part of moving forward is to focus more on the internet. Increasingly, people are listening to programs on our website, radiohcjb.org and reading articles there. Doing only traditional radio is no longer the best way to reach a large audience, so we are now calling ourselves a media ministry and combining radio with the internet. Sometimes keeping up with changing technology means that we need to stop doing other things. At the end of 2016 we will discontinue HCJB AM broadcasts. Our resources are limited, the numbers of listeners to AM radio is falling, and the decision was made to focus our efforts on using the internet.



Kichwa Streaming

One of HCJB's growing internet audiences is Kichwa on our web stream. Kichwa is the main indigenous language of Ecuador and there are over one million people who speak it. Even in remote communities, people have smart phones with internet service to listen to us on the web.

We plan to increase our Kichwa programming via internet for 2017, and we hope to begin partnering with a local Kichwa church to help produce the programs.
