He is now living at home, riding a cheap bike to get around and is struggling with depression. He started asking God to help him get up in the mornings and pick up the pieces of his life. Clearly God was working on Chris's heart so when we talked to him he was ready to hear what the Bible actually has to say about knowing Jesus, having a relationship with God, and how he could know for sure he was going to heaven. So we shared the Gospel with Chris and he prayed to receive Jesus. Last week we met with Chris and while he was smoking we started taking him through the fundamentals of Christianity and we will continue to do so the next few weeks.
