A Theme of "Surrender"

I grinned as the group muscled up to push our truck down the road. The students had just spent time inspecting my vehicle to learn all they could about it and now they were taking it for a spin...by pushing it. The parallel to our spiritual life was that we have a lot of knowledge about the Holy Spirit and we have access to the power of the Spirit, yet we tend to push in our own strength rather than depending on Him. How silly to push my truck from place to place when it is perfectly able to haul me and all twelve students farther and faster. Why do we not depend on God's power and how do we access it? What are we trying to accomplish on our own? These were some of the topics we wrestled with at the retreat we led last weekend for the UMaine Navigators group. God calls us to surrender, yield, die to self so that He can live in us. Pray that these motivated, faith-filled student leaders will do just that.
