During one evening debrief, Lily, age 15, said, “A highlight was when Aliza and I were sharing the Gospel through a fifteen year old translator, and I was so amazed that it was just us three young girls being missionaries in Panama!” **In three days, thirty-one people put their faith in Christ.** Praise the Lord!

PANAMA

We all agreed that one of the biggest highlights was seeing people’s faces when we ran murky brown water through the filter and it came out crystal clear. “There was an audible gasp when Shelby drank the water drawn from the river,” one teammate recalled. All of us admitted that we were leery about the first sip that would demonstrate the purity of the filtered water. And the families we served could hardly believe it. Today over seventy households are drinking pure water for the

first time, and if they clean the filters like we explained, they should continue to have healthy water for the next ten years. These families—especially the kids—will have new life. And through the Gospel, many will also have eternal life. Our team shared the Good News in over 78 homes, many of which had a dozen children. As one team member put it, “Not only did every one of us step outside our comfort zone to act in faith and do things that are far from normal, we were also training

people to share the Gospel with their non-believing family members.” And we loved the indigenous villagers. Many tears were shed as we hugged our new friends good-bye and kissed the babies one last time. What hope we have in knowing we will one day all be together again in Heaven.
