Marriage Retreat

A weekend away to play and focus on each other. A weekend away to rest in God's creation and the blazing colors of fall. A weekend away to realign with the heart of God. "It was absolutely awesome... everything I ever wanted out of a weekend," said one of the husbands in the group, "I appreciated the hands-on components that engaged both our bodies and minds; they were pointed and meaningful and relevant."

The hands-on experiences included a confession hike, a repel over a cliff, a canoe trip that brought up ways that we try to control each other, and an "I see you" couples walk. We addressed our sinful tendencies toward hiding, blaming, and controlling, and fought against those through actively walking in the light and

taking risks to be known, taking personal responsibility, and lovingly giving freedom to one another. The couples were honest about real pain they had been through and about current struggles. What a blessing to be able to grow together with the support of other believers who want to make marriage work, no matter how hard it can be. Some "A-ha!" moments included one wife admitting, "It is not my job to think for my spouse." And another husband confessing about his headship habits, "It feels like leading, but it's not." Following a session on communication, one couple was able to clarify and flesh out action steps for an issue they'd been plagued with for years.
