High Point

Last year we sold some land in southern Maine and built a camp on Lower Springy Pond in Clifton. The camp has a full basement for additional sleeping and three bathrooms for lots of guests. Our hope was to provide a place from which we could host Thrive groups through the winter and a place that our family could also enjoy. By God's grace we have been able to serve all kids of groups, from men's groups to women's retreats and youth retreats here at the Pond House. And, also by God's grace, it has enabled us to rent our house in Mount Desert for the summer to help pay for college for the kids and to begin paying off the cost of construction. Despite the lack of cell service and internet, we have enjoyed spending the summer on the pond and have been delighted to host Thrive events here over these months.

In a few weeks we will host a marriage retreat here, displacing our kids who will have to travel to southern Maine to be with grandparents for the weekend. Though this is not ideal, we are all used to vacating our rooms, sleeping on floors, or camping in the yard to make way for guests. Hospitality has become one of our biggest ministries since starting Thrive five years ago. We designed both our home and the pond house with this in mind and it is our joy to invite groups in and treat them as family. We believe that is one of the gifts that we can use for the glory of God, and conversations naturally lead to Jesus around a home-made pizza or a game of darts. We can envision serving this way into old age when our bodies can no longer white water raft and rock climb (closer all the time!) ©

This month we have been surprised again by the awesome work of the Lord. Our older neighbors here at the Pond House are selling their camp and offered it to us fully furnished. After much prayer and consultation we offered what we could, and though it was \$40,000 less than their asking price, they took it. We close in October on their camp, aptly named "High Point."
