
## Summer of Sending

As we mentioned before the summer, we had the opportunity to lead our regions' International Summer Mission Briefings and Debriefings. Basically, we have the teams come for training, vision and coaching prior to leaving overseas. Then, after returning to the U.S., they come back for a few days to process their experience so that it isn't just a summer that goes on the shelf so to speak. She came with us on her first mission trip when we led the Rome team, she then went to Australia as a student, then spent 2 years in Australia after graduating, and joined staff about 5 years ago. To see what God has done in her little life and what a leader she is made it such a special summer...a true privilege.



Lastly, a highlight was having teams write the names of people they had talked to about spirituality or had seen make a decision for Christ on paper stars. We then hung the stars in the room of our meeting. To see the hundreds of stars was moving, thinking that 2000 years ago Christ came to help us know what it means to have a relationship with God. <u>Overall, the 18 teams have shared with over 900 people and have seen 168 people pray to start a relationship with Christ</u>. So amazing! Thank you so much for your faithfulness to pray.

The other big news at this conference was that after 2 years of prayer and research, it was determined that it was indeed the time to change the name of Campus Crusade for Christ after 60 years to better reflect our ministry and to create a better dialogue with people who don't yet know Christ. The new name if you haven't heard yet is Cru. There were numerous things shared with us regarding the name change and again, if you email us, we can send you some links to great articles and how other ministries and pastors like John Piper have responded to the change. The bottom like for us, which we have experienced regularly on campus, is that many people are open to have a spiritual conversation, but often [and CCC's survey of a few thousand people confirmed it] when people hear who is doing the survey, they would then respond negatively to taking the survey [20% indicated this]. It wasn't that the Gospel or Christ was the issue, but our name was getting in the way of even having conversations. In branding, apparently a 2% negative response to a name or brand is considered horrible. For Campus Crusade for Christ, the number was 20% negative reaction to our name. The time had come. And to be clear, the mission hasn't changed or wavered.
