Dear Friends,

Jesus told the story of a great man who sent his servant to invite all he could to a banquet feast he was preparing. Capitalizing on this imagery, we commissioned Cru students to spend a week initiating spiritual conversation with the hopes that many would say yes and join us for the marriage feast of the lamb. We called the week *"Fill the Feast"* and it turned out to be such a fun week.

For many this was the first time they shared their faith, and the common theme was reports of celebration as they saw God move through them. After pairing up with one freshman, who had confessed his initial fear and apprehension, he told me how worthwhile it was and said that Cru needs to always be doing this.

Several Chinese students with very limited spiritual knowledge learned about Jesus. A brother who seemed distant, warmed up as his sister talked about faith.

Could it be that most who have reservations about sharing the gospel with strangers just haven't been a part of good conversations? Our experience is that when people with a little training and humble tact finally step out and talk with others about faith, it usually goes well.

In just four days, there were 355 spiritual conversations reported, 223 people heard the gospel, and at least 31 people indicated decisions for Christ. Here are their names:

Since that week, more people have heard and responded to the gospel as people have continued to have conversations.

This fall, a couple Madison churches hosted baptisms, and each featured some of our Cru students. All talked about the great growth they've experienced in college, and some described how they came to Christ through Cru. Watching from the front row of one of these worship services was one of the students who just a week prior heard the gospel and got connected to Cru during *Fill the Feast*.

Thank you for helping us equip students and faculty to keep stepping out to "Fill the Feast."
