God is now using him as a team leader in the Twin Cities.

It's encouraging to remember many examples like Sam now serving in a variety of occupations and settings.

It'll be exciting to see how and where the current upperclassmen step in to serve Christ in the future. May their hearts always be soft and their faith ever strong as they discover and live out their calling in whatever fields God calls them.
