While there, we memorized and internalized stories from the life of Jesus and got to share them over 200 times! It was an incredible time of fellowship, spiritual development, and many students shared their faith for the first time.

Em and I have been preparing for the Athens Half Marathon that takes place in a couple of weeks. We've been thankful for a mostly mild winter so that we were able to train largely without interruption.

Elliott and Judah have both been doing well also. Judah has been repeating everything we say and really becoming his own little person as he says and does new things all the time! We're trying to get them 1,000 hours of "outside time" this year and so far we are largely on pace to do just that!

Lastly, we have just begun taking Elliott to a speech therapist and have a future set of appointments set up with a child psychiatrist to give him the support he needs so that he can behaviorally and socially develop the skills that have been a struggle for him. Please continue to pray for Elliott, that the doctors and therapists would be able to assess him appropriately and develop a plan for him in the coming months. He is finally starting to make some new friends at school and playing with other kids on the playground, and we really feel that is a direct result of your prayers! He's also finally begun articulating his feelings and expressing interest in God and spiritual ideas, something he was never able to do before. He is a delight and we are grateful for your prayers and support.
