We're just a few weeks into the semester, and already there have been multiple reports of sexual assault, one student death by suicide, and abundant evidence that drinking/partying culture remains the norm for the majority of the student population. My heart is heavy as I'm reminded of the ways the world is not what it was intended to be.

Yet at the same time, there is much comfort to be found in knowing that in the end, darkness will not win. God is light, and he is at work in dark hearts and dark places.

So far this semester, our team has seen 19 people place their faith in Christ! **That's 19 new members of the Kingdom of the Son!** One of these is a freshman named Avery who I met the first week of classes. We met up for a cup of coffee together on Labor Day and as I asked her questions about her life and background, it became clear that even though she was from a non-religious family, she was incredibly curious to learn about God and faith.

When I asked her if she thought she had a relationship with God, she told me that **she didn't think so because she "didn't feel worthy" of God's attention or love.** That day I got to tell her the good news that God already loves her and thus despite her sin and unworthiness made a way for her to have an eternal, living relationship with Him through Jesus. And as God shone his light in Avery's heart, she chose to pray a simple prayer of faith that day!

There is much darkness to abhor and mourn in this life, but there is also great and lasting hope to be found in Jesus, as he ushers in the Kingdom of Light.
