This summer, in lieu of Summer Missions, students were invited to participate in virtual groups via Zoom. These groups studied theology, read the Bible, and learned about evangelism. One student, *Sarah, had begun having regular conversations with her co-worker, *Kyle. During one Zoom meeting, Sarah said she had decided she was going to invite him out for some (socially distant) coffee, and share the gospel with him. She sent a text, set up a date and time, and had her group pray for her.

When she showed up to get coffee though....Kyle didn't. She texted him. Then called him. Then looked for him at work. He never responded or showed. It seemed Sarah had been "ghosted". Not quite content to give up, Sarah began to poke around to see where Kyle had gone. To her surprise, she found out that he had been arrested and sent to prison.

Undeterred. Sarah decided she would write him a letter. After receiving her letter, Kyle called her.

"You know, you're the only person besides my own sister who has bothered to reach out to me. Thank you." Kyle said, sounding a bit teary. Prison was turning out to be a lonely experience, and the unexpected contact was welcome.

Sarah encouraged Kyle, and he began to attend a Bible study in prison. A few weeks later, Sarah received another letter

from Kyle. He wrote to tell her that he had decided to accept Christ and become a Christian.

"Thank you for reaching out to me...."

God is clearly still at work, and our students are still having an impact - even if only from a distance.
