Feed, change, play, nap, repeat. Don't forget the mountains of laundry, the endless drying of tears, the rocking and bouncing and shushing, the cleaning, the bathing - the work of caring for a very small child is predictable, but never ending.

Even as I write this prayer letter, Elliott is sitting on my lap trying to grab the keys (and crying because I won't let him.) The rhythms of our lives have changed significantly with Elliott's arrival, especially for me (Emily.)

As expected, I have had to rearrange my ministry to care for Elliott. I do as much as I can from home, doing the "behind the scenes" administrative work to keep things running like updating our social media, designing and printing any materials we need, and ordering supplies. I also am helping to lead a Freshman Community Group on West Green on Monday nights.

While I enjoy those parts of my job immensely, and am so glad to get to do them, it can be easy to feel like the important work of evangelizing and ministry is happening on campus, while I am stuck at home doing something relatively unimportant, like changing the 1,000th diaper of the day.

The other day I was trying to prepare the Bible study lesson for my Freshman Community Group, but was continually interrupted by Elliott. After re-reading the same sentence of the passage for what seemed like hours, I lost it.

"Can't he just give me 10 minutes to write this Bible study? This is important to my ministry!" I thought to myself irritably. At that moment, the Lord stopped me in my tracks and the thought occurred to me - "This is ministry, too."

I'd been thinking that the important ministry was "out there" - showing mercy to lost college students and evangelizing to the unbelieving. But in this season of my life, the ministry is also "in here." Right in my own home, I AM doing ministry.

All day long, I am displaying what God is like to Elliott as I care for him.

When I clean him up after a dirty diaper, I am displaying the same mercy that God shows to us when He cleanses us from sin, which we are unable to do ourselves. When I feed him, I provide for his daily need for nourishment the same way God provides for us. The parallels abound. It's a mercy to care for a college student, but it's also a mercy to care for a child.

Know the answer. Is the Grimm Reaper mentioned in the Bible?


