Fall semester is here! Right now, Southeast Ohio is once again swarmed with students coming to campus. The local Walmart has been overrun with parents buying last minute items for their kid's dorm

room. New students are wandering, confused about what buildings are where. Traffic is insane, especially because people won't know how to use the roundabout on Richland Avenue (it happens every year!).

While the reality of such events can be exciting, overwhelming, or even somewhat amusing, the spiritual reality is much different. In the search for personal fulfillment in an era of extreme individualism, many young Christians can lose their way, and many non-Christian students have no one in their lives telling them about Jesus.



By the numbers:

The percentage of unchurched adults has grown dramatically over the last several decades. Roughly *30%* of adults have no religious affiliation. We're seeing these translate to the student body as well.

- Research done as recently as 2019 indicates that 64% of young adults (18-29) will either stop going to church for a time or altogether, with this happening to many during their college years.
- Even in a time of spiritual decline, 90% of Americans, regardless of religious affiliation, believe in the presence of a higher power.
- According to Ohio University, as of June nearly 4700 first-year students showed that they intended to enroll in the fall. <u>That would make this the largest freshman class ever</u>, and the first class of over <u>4,000 since 2015!</u>
- Every year, we pass out both paper and digital questionnaires, with somewhere between *4,000 and 5,000* students filling one out. This accounts for 20%-25% of the student population on campus that we connect with in just 2 days!
- Annually, nearly 50% of students will request more information about a relationship with God, a Bible study on campus, and articles on God's existence, among many other things!
- We have a team of 7 full-time staff, 3 part- time staff, 1 hourly staff, 3 full-time interns, and 3 volunteers


Sabbatical/Summer by the Numbers
