EWI ORGANIZES EVENTS IN ITALY, AUSTRIA, MOROCCO, BELGIUM, HOLLAND & FRANCE



October was a busy training month for the European Worship Institute (EWI), with events in Padova, Italy and Vienna, Austria. More than 50 attended 'ConVerge Italy', coming from churches in Italy, Albania and Switzerland. And 58 attended our FOCUS event at Vienna Christian Center. Bryan Grisham, worship &

missions pastor of Calvary Church in Shreveport led the training team for these events. In January, Jeff leads a training team to Casablanca, Morocco for our first ConVerge event there, followed by ConVerge events in February and March in Brussels, Holland and Paris.

We're also in the discussion stage with churches in Rome, Germany, and Finland about future training events in those countries and we're planning our first 'Worship Camp' July 9-13 in Brussels with Shreveport's Calvary Church as our guest teaching team.

Some 75 attended the 'Artrageous Cafe', which featured an evening of music, dance, painting, and coffee in a candle-lit setting. Some 35 artists attended our 'Artrageous Seminar & Workshops' which featured Finnish singer/songwriter 'Nina Astrom' speaking on 'Communicating Christ Through The Arts' as well as five artistic workshops.



Our goal with 'Artrageous' is to encourage, inspire, and educate artists to be salt and light in the world with their artistic gifts as well as use them to serve in the church. More to come with this exciting new venture.

THE BRIDGE AND CHRISTIAN CENTER: THE HEARTBEAT OF OUR DAILY LIVES



We love what God is doing through Artrageous and the European Worship Institute but the heartbeat of our daily lives is the local church. For us, that now encompasses two expressions: The Bridge in Paris and Christian Center in Brussels, where we rotate our Sundays each week and lead a team of 15 in Paris and a team of 35 in Brussels.

We are currently working to develop two worship teams in Paris and four teams in Brussels. Organizing, training, and mentoring these musicians and singers is our top priority in working with these churches.

We were also involved in Christmas program outreaches in both churches. Jeff produced the Christian Center choir outreach program, 'It's Christmas Once Again', developing the theme and narration and helped plan a special Christmas worship service at The Bridge in December.
