Project: Healing Hand



In April, Justin broke a bone in his hand and had to have outpatient surgery. This involved putting a small titanium plate and four pins in the bone, which was broken into two pieces.

Although we carry health insurance on Justin, it's a policy with a high deductible of \$4500.00. So far, costs for this injury include a \$200 urgent care visit, a \$500 doctor visit (including follow-ups), a \$1255 surgeon's fee, and a \$2500 deposit to the outpatient surgery center - bringing us very close to the \$4500 deductible amount.

This has become an immediate burden on us... not to mention a lot of PAIN for Justin who has had to stop working for two weeks while the hand heals.

Broadmoor Missions Team Touches Paris

One of our supporting churches, Broadmoor Baptist in Shreveport, made their fifth missions trip to Europe to work with us and their first trip to Paris. This amazing team of 17 volunteers rolled up their sleeves and worked on multiple projects during their time with us. Here's a day-by-day recap:

Sunday Service

The team helped us set up and tear down for church, and taught Children's Church and toddlers' classes. Bruce Goudeau served with us on the worship team by playing electric guitar and Ronnie Cates, Broadmoor sound and media tech, observed the Bridge's sound and media team, offering tips.

Bridge Service Projects

On Monday, the team divided into several groups to help with various Bridge service projects. One team helped clean out the Bridge storage area, conducted inventory and hauled trash. Another team cleaned out 1,500 plastic Easter Eggs and filled them with fresh candy in preparation for our Easter Egg Hunt. Another team led by Kathy went into Paris to help a Bridge family clean their apartment after moving out. At the end of the day, everyone came together to remove old labels from water bottles and put new ones on, in preparation for a future water bottle giveaway.

Les Mureaux

On Tuesday, the team went to a Parisian suburb called 'Les Mureaux' to help put finishing touches on a church renovation project. This African immigrant church is located in a Muslim-influenced area and has endured great persecution to remain there. Nevertheless, this church continues to thrive.

Night Ministry

Topping off Tuesday: several from the Broadmoor team joined the Bridge youth for a pizza/bowling party while the others had a pizza/moving party, helping one of our Bridge staff members change apartments.



On Wednesday, the team left the hotel at 7:00 am to distribute thousands of flyers at train stations promoting Easter services. In the afternoon we went to a huge food fair in south Paris where we collected thousands of pounds of food for the homeless. The six-hour project was at times, chaotic and back-breaking but the Broadmoor team enjoyed helping meet the needs of the homeless. In between the projects, Jeff and Kathy took Lydia and Analese Gunn to the American Church in Paris to deliver 43 'Pillow Pets' to volunteers who will take half of them to orphans in Bulgaria and the other half to underprivileged children in Paris. This project was a dream of Analese, one of the teenagers who came on the trip.

All in all, it was a great week of ministry projects that ministered to the Bridge team, the Bridge congregation, a sister church, Parisians and children near and far. Thanks to Broadmoor Baptist for their partnership in our ministry and a special thanks to this team for coming to Paris to make a difference.

European Worship Institute Breaks New Ground

The European Worship Institute has made some great strides:

- March ConVerge seminars in Belgium and Holland were our most wellattended events ever.
- ConVerge seminars are scheduled for the first time in Italy and Morocco next fall.
- We're planning an event in Vienna for worship leaders involved in the Fellowship of European International Church network.
- We're in discussion with a Parisian organizer to bring ConVerge to Paris in 2012.
- And we've booked Continental Theological Seminary in Brussels as the location for our 2012 Worship Camp.

To be sure, 2011-2012 will be a big year for the Worship Institute as we expand to at least four new countries and plan our first training camp.

Formerly called 'The Brussels-European Worship Institute', this year, we changed the name to 'The European Worship Institute' to reflect our growing geographic scope. We also felt it was time to expand

our vision so we developed three distinct programs to meet training needs on three levels. We now offer the following:

- FOCUS retreats for individual church worship teams.
- **ConVerge** seminars for multiple church worship teams.
- Camp Worship, a European-wide intensive training camp.

In addition, we're developing a church media track to address the growing need to train volunteers in how to use church websites, social media, videos, and projection programs in order to enhance worship services and church outreaches.

We believe as we pour into worship teams and media ministries, they will be better equipped to serve their churches and that this will, in turn, strengthen the European church.

European Worship Institute ConVerges in Brussels & The Netherlands

In March, we organized two ConVerge seminars through The European Worship Institute and enjoyed our largest attendance yet in both Belgium and The Netherlands.

About 125 from at least 25 churches attended the Brussels event while 120 from more than 30 churches attended the Delft event.

Our teaching team for these two events came from Pinelake Church, Brandon, Mississippi. Led by worship pastor Kent Vincent, the team consisted of a full band and vocalists. "We couldn't have asked for better turnout for these events," said Jeff.

"In Belgium we had 92 French speakers and 35 English-speakers... which indicated real success in reaching Belgians. In The Netherlands, we had participants drive up to 2.5 hours to attend. We were amazed by the passion of those wanting to grow in their giftings."

Our fourth event in The Netherlands, ConVerge was sponsored by Living Waters Church and Pastor David Koerts, who publicized the event throughout the

Netherlands. EWI was featured in a national Christian Dutch magazine and registrations were taken on a popular Christian Dutch website. Here are some of the comments made:
