As I write this, Harrison is sleeping at my feet in a bouncy seat in our living room. My heart cannot contain all the joy we've been experiencing while being home with him.

We shed many tears as we packed up our life out in CO. Many were joyful as we celebrated God's hand of provision in our lives. As all three of us drove away from the hospital tears were flowing down and my prayer was simply, "Thank you doctors, thank you nurses... thank you Jesus." There were also sad tears surprisingly. Saying goodbye to all the primary nurses was the hardest part of leaving.



Traveling home was a lot easier than we anticipated. Harrison slept 98% of the time while we were in the car and we were able to make it home in 3 days of driving like we planned.

This whole threshold we've walked through to become parents has looked a lot different than Erin or I envisioned. But we have seen God's fingerprints all over this story. Harrison had no surgeries during his time at the hospital, and has been issued a clean bill of health. Everyone is optimistic about his prognosis. We anticipate what God has in store for this child and how God will work in and through his life.
