So many people spoke to me afterwards about their own struggles with friendships and suffering in general. I do think that God used that talk to prepare many of the women for the weekend and it was an amazing time of sharing and vulnerability as a result. What a blessing to be used in that way! I know that this year's Oasis was truly that - a place of growth and refreshment for our women. I'm confident that the students in our region have benefited as a result. I love our staff and it is such a privilege to care for them.
