

You may remember that Guy did the studio equipment design and assisted with the installation work for this station in the capital city of Mongolia. The last quarter of the year was very busy. Guy spent two thirds of his time in the Philippines as the project manager for the Iba Renovation Project. He completed his assignment on this major project in early December. Guy also traveled to Singapore

several times for meetings with the International Office staff as well as to our FEBC Station in Sulawasi, Indonesia. Since we have now returned to the US, Guy will be increasing his travel schedule so that he can spend adequate time in Asia. He is pleased that his work in Iba is done and that several of the long running projects in Indonesia are also finished since this will give Guy the time to get organized as team leader of the IO Engineering Support Team. The current travel schedule is to visit Indonesia, Singapore and Thailand in late February and early March. A trip to Mongolia and to visit FEBC Korea in Seoul will follow in mid-April. Although it might seem that working from the US would be a problem, all of the IO engineering staff are in different countries scattered around the world. They all telecommute to get the job done so the only hassle for Guy is that each trip is a couple of days longer in order to hop over the Pacific each way.
