Dear Family and Friends, we pray that all is well with you and your families. 12/17/10

As this Christmas season leaps upon us, we are reminded of the sacrifice our Lord Jesus made in leaving His Heavenly home to come to earth. Sacrifice is not a word often associated with Christmas in our world today, but the two most important sacrifices of all time came 2000 yrs. ago with the incarnation of Christ and 33 yrs later the sacrifice He made for our sins on the Cross. *"But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man."* Hebrew 2:9

It's almost time for camp there in Bolivia and this year it will be quite different. In past years they have found a place to hold it in a local school facility only to have the school change their mind at the last minute and then we scramble to find a new place. This year it will be held in a very rustic location without buildings so they will be using tents (which are not easy to come by and must be made.) Pastor Arcil is holding a competition among the young people in bringing visitors to church for earning scholarships. We always like to motivate as many as possible to attend camp.

Our oldest son Brandon has enlisted in the U.S. Army and is scheduled to go to boot camp in early April followed by jump school. We are very proud of him.

We look forward to all of our children being "home" for Christmas with us this year and staying with us a short time in a home we are renting in St. Petersburg, FL at D&D Missionary homes. Their grandparents also will join us here, a rare treat to all be together!
