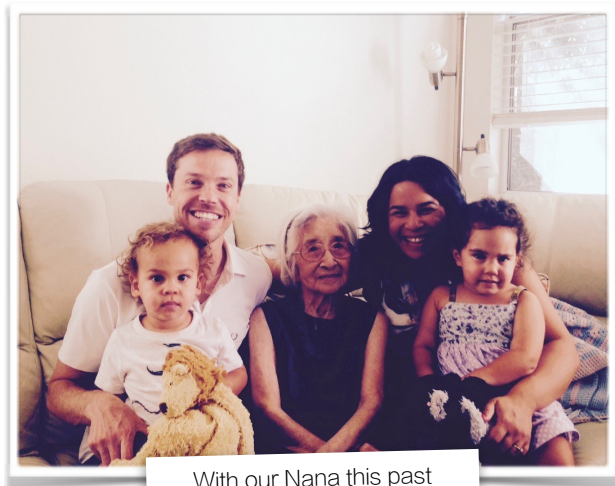




Nich & Tricia Beebee | March 2016 | Epic Movement  a ministry of CRU
