*God created us, and He loves us.* So begins the Japanese version of Campus Crusade for Christ's well-known "Four Spiritual Laws" gospel tract.

Jungshin and I spent three Saturdays this month teaching some eager young adults how to use the Four Spiritual Laws to introduce their Japanese friends to Jesus. It was a team effort: I organized the materials and taught the seminars, and Jungshin gave advice and feedback and translated everything into Korean.

Working together was lots of fun, and it made me excited about our future in Japan together. *I'm very fortunate to have a gifted partner like Jungshin to serve alongside me in the mission God has called us to.*

It's also exciting getting chances to continue investing in Japan while I'm living here in Korea. Most of the people who attended the evangelism seminars are involved in ministry to the Japanese and/or considering missionary work in Japan in the future. The more people we can equip and

encourage to share the gospel, the more Japanese we'll be able to impact for Christ. *Thank you for your prayers for that time!*

During the seminar, one of our homework assignments was to try to share the gospel with a friend. After two months of waiting and praying, I finally had a chance to talk about Christ with **Takuma** (who I mentioned last month) over lunch one Friday.

Though he doesn't understand the gospel yet, his response was positive. I gave him a Christian comic book to read while he's in Japan over the break. *Please continue to pray for Takuma.*

School ended last week, and with it my official career as a Korean language student. I won't miss the morning commute or the homework, but it's sad saying goodbye to my friends on campus. Still, I'm grateful when I think back on all I was able to learn and experience these past few months.

By God's grace, I also got to expose a lot of different people—a Chinese Communist Party member, a French Muslim—to biblical truth through presentations, in-class discussions, and the gospel tracts I gave them. Hopefully I set a good example through my actions, as well.

Most of my classmates will be staying in Korea long-term, so I'd like to keep meeting with them as long as I'm here. *Please pray God*

*would lead me to those who are most open and provide opportunities to share Christ with them more directly over the next few months.*

For now, Jungshin and I are getting ready to join 10,000 students from all over Korea for CCC's annual Summer Conference. She'll be teaching a seminar, and I'll be doing what I can to promote missions to Japan. *Please pray that it would also be a time for us of spiritual refreshment.*
