Merry Christmas! After months of prayer and paperwork, we've finally reached the end of the first part of our journey back to Japan. <u>Jungshin</u> <u>passed her interview on Tuesday</u> (12/14), and as I was writing this, we received her visa in the mail!

It's amazing how God has orchestrated circumstances these past few weeks to get us back to America in time for Christmas, just as we had been praying all along. *He even blessed us with cheap airline tickets*, even though we had to book them less than 10 days in advance.

In fact, if I had to choose a theme for the past few months, it would be this: **God answers specific, faithful prayer**. I was reminded of that again this morning as I looked over the prayer requests I wrote for our ministry to Japanese students before we started back in October.

Some were very specific: "3-4 students to continue the ministry after we're gone"; "2-3 of my friends from language school to come"; "1-2 new students to get involved"; "a chance to share the gospel with most of them." Even just looking at our **Christmas Party** last night, *I can honestly say that all of these were answered*.

Out of the 7 non-Christian students who came, **3** were people I knew from language school, and **4** were students we met since the start of the semester. We also had **3** committed Korean students there to help us.

During the party, I had a chance to share about the significance of Jesus Christ's birth. **Two students later said that they had prayed with me to believe in Him personally**. Only time will tell, but for now, please remember **Ikumi** and **Noriko** especially in your prayers this month.

Ted has also shown a greater openness to the gospel since you started praying for him last month. Because he's been busy preparing for an English exam, we haven't had much time to study the Bible together recently.

But God has clearly been working in his life, and he's started reading the Bible on his own more regularly. We're meeting for the last time in a few hours. Hopefully I'll connect him to some guys from CCC at the weekly chapel tonight.
