Multiplication

My friends in Haiti planted a two acre garden this past summer to support their ministry. It's producing great results. They were excited to show me on my last trip. **Their** initiative, their risk, and **their** reward. Fantastic! What next...

WATER ~ Flood irrigation is effective, but not efficient. It is costly to run a gas powered pump to water crops.

Solution... Water tanks and drip irrigation.

LAND ~ Demand is very high for peppers and cabbage in Port au Prince. Wholesalers scour the hills looking for growers.

Solution... Lease 100 acres of land for 5 years. Strategically expand.
