


This month I was asked to lead a task force of like minded ministries in Haiti which focus is on economic development as part of their vision. Some of the team members are from the largest ministries in Haiti.

Our team has two goals:

- 1. Identify the armers growing corn in Haiti, and encourage more farmers to grow corn.
- 2. Encourage US based feeding programs to purchase a larger portion of their food from Haitien farmers.

I'm sure many of you have seen or taken part in a food drive where you took scoops of corn, along with other items and packaged them for shipment. We are encouraging that the corn be purchased local, in Haiti. This incremental change will have a positive impact for Haitien farmers.



Last month I told you about my friend Pastor Jude. A US based ministry will be traveling with me to Haiti in July. Together, we will meet with Pastor Jude and see the village (10 miles from Open Door) where he has been called into his pastorate. Poverty affects all of Haiti, and while no one ministry will save Haiti, we all can influence eradicating poverty through strengthening the church to help her serve and reach the lost and hurting with Christ's love.

This is a key longterm partnership for THM. The US based ministry has as one of it's priorities, economic development. They have built chicken houses for another church in Port au Prince housing more than 8,000 birds.

They are interested in working alongside THM as we together develop the expansion of the Haiti corn industry. They also want to assist in opening markets and encourage commercial farming.
