
Thousand Hills Ministry

The picture above provides a look at some of the farm land used to sustain the seminary and orphanage and if blessed to feed the hungry in the village. Picture was just taken in a extreme drought.

Future needs of the seminary are identified in green text. Solar power is such a value in

Haiti with gas prices still over \$26 per gallon. The only garden watered by solar is below the orphanage and anything on the seminary campus. With more panels and batteries we can water consistently the land across the dirt road from the seminary, a close walk for students to work on their own garden. Other needs are dorm rooms and covered patio. We are completely out of room for bunk beds. With more students expected next year, sleeping on the floor in classrooms is what we are facing. As part of the board, it is my duty to cast the vision for future expansion and raise the funds and teams to build the new dorm rooms. The land behind the seminary will be available for purchase when we have the money in hand. Expected price is 30k and the land is twice the size of the Fellowship Hall.

Meet Osianie Pierre Gilles she

lives in Lacienne with her husband Joselien, who is a gardener, and they have one child.

Osianie is a member of the worship service team and one of the cleaners of the church.

She is one of the beneficiaries of the goat farm project and has been blessed by the results. She took the funds from selling young goats and leveraged those funds to borrow more money called "Tipa" where

people can register and get access to loan money with a low rate. (more on that next month. All 36 churches collect money and started their own bank with managers and lending departments)

With the loan from the church bank, she has started a small food products business in the community of Çerca, the bigger part of Lacienne. She buys bags of; corn, beans and peanuts from local farmers, processes them and goes to the big town of Ceca to sell finished products. After paying taxi fees, she comes back home with 15% over each bag of products, fortunately this initiative is increasing, she uses the profit to take of her family, paying for school and is almost finished with paying off her loan.

Joselien and Osianie are planning to build their house soon on a plot of land they bought last month. (pictured above)
