



Greetings friends.

Pastor Odimond Monfiston, the President of the Open Door Churches in Central District, Haiti. He's got a big heart for Christ and a big responsibility - he leads the pastors of 15 churches in the Central district of Haiti.

But that's not all - he also manages two trade schools and leads an agriculture co-op. These schools and co-ops are church ministry tools, designed to help the people in the area and show them the love of Christ.

Ten years ago, Pastor Odimond was just starting out, leading a single church at Magauyave. THM provided his team with over 200 goats, and his team has been taking great care of them ever since. The goats have been a lifesaver for that church and 10 other churches, providing food, school tuition, medical needs, and income for years.

Today, the agricultural co-op led by Pastor Odimond has a big vision. Expand the agricultural program, grow more food, create more paying jobs, and demonstrate the love of Jesus.

Some context -

Two separate events took place in this area several years ago:

1. A philanthropic man took on the endeavor of drilling a well on top of a mountain. It hit an

underground spring, and water constantly flows out of this well down the mountain in PVC pipes, in a slow, steady stream.

2. A bunch of goats were sold from the Magauyave farm. THM lent an additional hand financially to buy farmland.

This farmland purchase is at the base of that mountain— free water flowing to it.

Now the need is to capture it— and disperse it when needed using gravity. No pump.
