staff advisor, we were able to once again re-enter the campus in order to help facilitate meetings, lead time in the Word, and pray for our students. Though our movement was reduced in size due to the amount of students opting for virtual learning, we have had a core of dedicated students who attended and continued to seek God's will for the campus. A few students also were regularly sharing their faith on campus during the semester.
