By now you may have heard that Jerry Falwell, Jr. has resigned as the president of Liberty. As community service partners with the University, we are praying for all that are involved. Our hearts break for the Liberty community, and we are praying for the Lord to lead those to repentance that need to repent. We pray, too, that this leads to an improved reputation for Liberty in the eyes of the world so that students and faculty will have more opportunities to influence people for Christ. The students are confused, grieved, and embarrassed. Last night at Liberty's first Campus Community meeting, Pastor David Nasser opened the time with an apology, which served as a salve for what we are hoping is the beginning of a healing work.

Please join us in praying, too, for Jerry Prevo, the acting President and former chairman of the board (whom the students respect, and affectionately refer to as "the new Jerry") as he enters into much stress and conflict, and that the Lord would be behind his leadership decisions. Jerry Prevo was replaced by Dr. Allen McFarland, who is the first black chairman of the board. Interestingly enough, Dr. McFarland's daughter, Regina Robinson and her husband Jua are pastors in Boston and friends of ours. They were our speakers at our first fall retreat we held in Virginia in 2013.
