AN AMAZING YEAR IN REVIEW

May has descended upon us with a bizarre expectancy. Like you, we continue to wonder if there is purpose and meaning behind these uncertain times. Like you, we try to prepare for a whole host of scenarios for the future. Like you, we press into the Lord and try to not worry about tomorrow, "for each day has enough trouble of its own (Matthew 6:34)." This, though, is antithetical to our very nature as college ministers, as we have been planning and preparing for the future for fourteen years every May. It is as seasonal to us as the blooming flowers.

However, several experts, such as ministry strategist Tim Casteel in his blog post entitled, "What if there's no fall?", have recommended against the typical ornate planning and preparation that occurs in early May as ministry teams around the country concluded the semester with students, coaching groups, discipleships, and staff teams this month, and rather suggested we begin in late June. Though we see the wisdom in that with so many unknowns at this point, it was unusual to devote little time to strategic planning with our team during our "DOPE" (Days of Planning and Evaluation) days with our student leaders and staff.

What resulted instead was a greater focus on prayer, celebration and worship, as we reconsidered all that the Lord had done this year. Our initial mission statement was simply "Double It" - that the Lord would increase two fold what He had done the year before. When we considered the numbers as a team, we could do nothing short of praise His faithful name.

- 17 students came to Christ (3 last year)
 - 4 of which Jena and I had the opportunity to lead to Christ
- 70 students attended Fall Retreat from Lynchburg (28 last year)
- 27 students attended Winter Conference (10 last year)
- 62 students committed to going on an international spring break trip (45 last year)
- 10 students accepted to intern as national/international missionaries (5 last year). 1 of which will be joining our Lynchburg Team next year!

- 212 students actively involved in serving in Lynchburg Cru (150 last year)
- 8 colleges and high schools have Cru movements (4 last year)
 - This includes the launch of Cru at VUL, Sweet Briar, and 2 High Schools

We have been so grateful for our team, our students, and (of course) the Lord Himself this year. It has been a relief to table the anxieties and uncertainties of the future to be able to celebrate our supreme, sovereign Lord and His unchanging power and grace.
