TEAM LEADER RETREAT...IN CUBA!

As Team Leaders, Andrew and I are required to attend two Team Leader conferences annually — one with our Cohort (the Delaware-Maryland-Virginia region, which we lovingly refer to as the DMV) and one for the country. This year the DMV decided to create a hybrid conference/mission trip to Havana, Cuba to partner with Filter of Hope, a sister mission organization that distributes water filters to areas without clean water access. This was a first time for our Cohort, and we decided as a group to travel with our families as well. A few weeks ago, with 18 staff kids and 19 staff, we spent the week in meetings and in ministry.

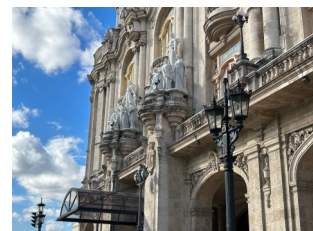
One of the most exciting experiences we had was installing water filters with Samuel, and seeing him excited about installing them and demonstrating how they work. Samuel and all the other children had a blast together during the time there and even got to go to the zoo and aquarium.



At one house, we met a man who had dreamed the night before that we were coming and to anticipate our arrival! He was a practice of Santeria, but

after hearing a clear gospel presentation, he accepted the true message of Christ and denounced his former religion. But before leaving, he told us that in the dream one of us had asked him "where is the statue?" and when we inquired, he brought out a bust of what looked to be Jesus. In Santeria, members believe that the actual idol itself has power, and our translator, who was formerly involved in Santeria herself, urged him to destroy it. We then took it out to his court-

yard and with his permission, smashed it in the name of Jesus. Through that experience Samuel has been able to have a greater understanding of our risen King and that we are enabled by the power of the Holy Spirit to destroy strongholds. Praise God!
