A HEART FOR JESUS

Two days before his 44th birthday, Andrew suffered a heart attack caused by two arteries that were 100% blocked. He had been doing exhaustive yard work in extremely cold weather in preparation for an impending snowstorm. We spent the snowstorm at Martha Jefferson Hospital, where Andrew had surgery to receive two stents to open the arteries. Though there is a history of heart disease in Andrew's family, it came as a shock to us. Ironically, Andrew was born at Martha Jefferson — a place which has brought him life now, twice! Andrew spent his birthday in the hospital recovering, praising God for his life and for the opportunity to continue to enjoy the life He has given us.

Now more than ever we are compelled to continue to do the work that the Lord has called us to. Facing Andrew's mortality reminds us that life indeed is a vapor (James 4:14), and that the gospel is an urgent message to be delivered to a world whose destiny is to die (once) and then face judgment (Hebrews 9:27). We are grateful for the work He has called us to and for you, our generous and gracious supporters, who enable the work.
