FUELED UP AND READY TO GO ON CAMPUS!

What an amazing summer we had in Fort Collins, Colorado. We mentioned the classes we took in our last letter that were part of the staff training we participated in this summer. The course work was very challenging but we were thankful for the experience and knowledge we gained from it. We are now better prepared to minister to students on campus.

After staff training ended, we had a few days to rest and we visited Rocky Mountain National Park (see picture of Andrew and Logan below). After that short break, the US Staff Conference began. For about eight days we had sessions each morning and afternoon in Moby Arena at CSU where we worshipped, heard about what is going on within the ministry, and heard from a variety of speakers including Pastor Tim Keller and the Rev. Keith Battle. Keller spoke about the importance of understanding justification for ourselves and when explaining the Gospel to others. His point was that we usually understand the forgiveness aspect but we miss out on a big part of the Gospel if we don't also explain justification. He gave the idea of a person getting out of

prison as an example of forgiveness. He said that justification goes beyond getting out of jail in that the prisoner is not only released but then given the Congressional Medal of Honor as well. In other words, when a person becomes a Christian, they are not only forgiven, but also given the righteousness of Christ.

After returning to Boston on July 31st, we spent two short days there and then hit the road to visit friends, family and supporters in Virginia and North Carolina. We were grateful to reconnect with so many people while visiting our old hometown of Charlottesville, VA.

August 12th was a special day for us as we celebrated our ninth anniversary. Our marriage began doing full-time ministry together as staff interns with Campus Crusade in 2000. We will soon be going on campus to do full-time ministry again and we couldn't be more excited. We are learning to live by faith each day as we trust God to provide for us in every endeavor.
