Olivia expressed how inspired she was by what God had done in Sarah's life and wanted to get together for coffee and hear more about the changes in Sarah's life.

Sarah's Spiritual Journey (Umass Sophomore)

Intellectually, I always knew who God was and that He existed, but had never experienced Him in a personal way. Growing up I didn't know anyone else my age who did so I lived like God didn't really exist in my life.

All through high school I was with the popular crowd and involved in the party life. Around the beginning of my senior year, I started smoking pot with my friends on the weekends. I started lying more and more to my parents about where I was going, who I was with, and about the fact that I was high. By the end of the summer after senior year I was smoking everyday, and lying about everything.

At UMass, I was constantly high, and I used weed to keep myself from thinking about how unhappy I was and how unfulfilling my life felt. I gained weight and was very unhappy with my self-image. At the time, I didn't realize that God was trying to get my attention.

I heard about a fall retreat with Campus Crusade for Christ, and went on the trip to NH. It was my first time in months of being at UMass that I felt really happy and loved. Over winter break I went to a conference in Boston where God showed me my worth in His eyes, and I felt His love in such an incredible way that it drastically changed the way I saw myself.

It was over a spring break trip that I finally surrendered my whole life to God. I vowed to give up smoking and all of the things in my life that I knew were clearly wrong in God's eyes. I struggled a lot (and still do) with giving up pot but it was well worth it in every way. Since spring break, my life has completely changed. I no longer define myself by worthless desires like smoking. I have a whole new identity in Christ and I have never been happier.

It's been so encouraging to see our students stepping out in faith. Some have decided to go on summer missions despite their non-christian parent's opposition, others have invited their friends to a Crusade function for the first time.

Since spring break, we've seen nearly all of our Big Break students openly engaging in spiritual conversations and taking the initiative to share the gospel with their peers and professors.

Lastly, we had a ton of fun sharing the gospel in the UMass campus center using the soularium (http://www.campuscrusade.com/WSN/soul.htm) and a little creative interior decorating. In all we were able to engage in over 50 significant spiritual conversations over the course three days. It was a student idea, manned and executed by our students (with just a little staff help). Over 10 students were involved in sharing their faith and setting up each day and coordinating with the university administration. Praise God!
