Happy Chinese New Years! Each year during our spring semester break, we head down to Panama City Beach (PCB), Florida for the "Big Break" short-term mission trip with Campus Crusade for Christ. The reason we head down to PCB is that it is the #1 spring break destination for college students, nationwide. Each year over 300,000 college students flock to PCB to "party" in the month of March. From binge drinking to getting high, from one night stands to crazy nightlife,

students come hoping to experience all that life has to offer. It is in the middle of this, what is arguably the largest college party in the US, we find a surprising and unlikely opportunity for the gospel. Because each year as Christ-following students step out in faith and take the initiative to share the gospel on the beaches and in the nightclubs, we find that God, whose heart longs for the lost,

redeems and restores thousands unto Himself. (Last year, in the week we were down in PCB we saw over 670 decisions for Christ!)

We will be leaving March 13th for PCB and God willing we will be taking over 40 students with us. This is almost double the number of students we took with us last year. It is to God's glory that each year we have seen an increase in the num-

ber of students willing and even eager to accept the challenge to be His witness to lost students at PCB. We are especially joyful for the addition of 12 Epic students from UMass and Smith College this year. Last year 2 Epic students went with us, so this is an incredible increase. Our hope is that the training and experience these Epic students will receive at Big Break will translate into incredible momentum for the gospel among the Asian Americans at UMass and Smith College.
