I may be a little biased, but the way my friends in Japan are reacting to the devastation is remarkable. We've probably all been impressed with Japan's resilience in the face of disaster. When that grit is combined with the humility of Japanese Christians, I'm left in awe!

Most know that Japan is a place of diligence and meticulousness to say the least. Japanese Campus Crusade for Christ (JCCC) is no exception. Every Bible lesson and ministry event is prepared with painstaking detail. What I truly admire is how this care is coupled with immense dependence on God's leading. My brothers and sisters in Japan acted no differently when the massive earthquake and ensuing tsunami and nuclear troubles struck.
