Because these kinds of practices are deeply rooted in her life, Naomi said that it would take a long time but that maybe someday she would come to believe in God and the Bible.

With her recent loss and other challenges, Naomi is really questioning genuine love and peace right now. I can discuss her thoughts and questions with her, but of course there's no way to truly impact her life apart from God's hand. So I would really love your prayers for all of us. Naomi and Arnoult live very close to me (with her father) and have recently often been attending my church. She finds the content to be pretty foreign and challenging but seems to be persevering. Please pray for the comfort of her and her family and for them to clearly experience Christ's love.
