Haruna then went on to ask about my life and experience as a foreigner. We talked about politics, education, and religion. Apparently not many students her age touch on these topics or express their thoughts freely about them. She just kept jumping from topic to topic, enthusiastically sharing and asking questions. I loved it. Of course we had fun and had a few good laughs, but we talked primarily about well thought out and meaningful content.

That day we didn't dive into the Bible by any means, but I think Haruna's desire to talk about social issues and deep subjects is also reflective about how she's thirsting to know more about her meaning in life and the hope found in Jesus. She actually attended church with one of our interns this past spring and expressed the desire to trust in Christ. However, when she shared about her experience with her mom, she was forbidden to go back. In fact, she was told she couldn't go to any Christian gatherings.
