This past month has been full of follow-up, meetings, activities, and evangelism. Here's a brief overview of each of these:

Follow-Up

During the first couple weeks we received close to 200 new contacts from RIT students. It was a goal of the Servant Team and CCC staff to try to follow up with each of those individuals within the first couple weeks. The purpose of following-up with individuals is to get to know each student better, hear about their spiritual journey (which may lead into sharing the Gospel with that individual), and tell them more about CCC and how they can be involved.

Friday Night Meetings

Every Friday night, RIT Campus Crusade for Christ meets in Allen Chapel on campus for a time of worship, teaching, fellowship, and fun. The past 3 weeks we've averaged about 65 people in attendance. The topics that have been discussed each week relate to the theme of RIT CCC: Real Life, Real Love, Real People.

Real Life: We believe real life is found through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ

Real Love: We believe God's love is amazing and we want to share that love with others

Real People: We believe in being authentic and building each other up

On top of great Biblical teaching, Friday nights offer the opportunity to meet new students and get to know each of them more. It has been such a joy for us to learn more about the lives of RIT students. There seems to be a true sense of community among the students involved in CCC at RIT.

Evangelism

Each day that we are on campus, we make an effort to spend time doing evangelism. Oftentimes we use short surveys pertaining to a student's religious background in order to create a spiritual discussion. The last question on one of the surveys is: On a scale from 1 to 10, rate your desire to know God. We've seen many students answer that question with a 6 or above. When that opportunity comes up, it is then that we make the effort to share the Gospel with them. We may share our salvation testimony, the 4 Spiritual Laws, and/or directly out of the Bible.
