Changing lives is the business God is in. It is true for DeAnn and me, and it is true for UW-Madison students! Two weeks ago we launched a unique internet outreach centered around telling our friends and the world how Jesus has changed our lives.

We launched a website (uwsi.wordpress.com) to which we posted our changed life stories from Student Impact at UW-Madison. 121 different stories were posted to the site and then our students shared their stories via email, blogs, and Facebook (a popular social networking site). The response was amazing! In the past two weeks there have been 12,465 visits to the site. Each story ends with a link to EveryBadger.com which shares the message of salvation and answers hard questions that students may have. 244 people have continued on to visit EveryBadger.com!

Excited is a word that gets overused. But excited is what I am! The implications of this outreach are huge. Quite possibly every student at UW-Madison had the opportunity to read a story of Jesus working in the lives of one of their friends. Students' families and distant relatives were reached. High school friends that now are at different schools also had a chance to read about Jesus. Not only did those readers then get the opportunity to visit another site with the gospel message but they were able to interact with someone they know who loves Jesus!
