Looking Back Over the Year

Finishing our first full year of campus ministry gives us a chance to look back, review, and thank God for what he has done. We have seen people come to Christ and grow in their relationship with Him. We've seen freshmen come to college and, instead of walking away from their faith, they have experienced a new depth to their relationship with the Lord. We've seen believers take steps of faith and share their faith with friends, roommates, and complete strangers. Thanks for being a part of this! Praise God!

In order to give you a view of what the ministry at Madison looks like, I wanted to give you some numbers from the end of the year. It's exciting to see how the Lord is at work. In an increasingly secular society, God is bringing increasing numbers of people into relationship with Himself. So here are the numbers... At UW-Madison we ended with 400 students involved in small group Bible studies! I think that is my favorite statistic. 400 UW-Madison students studying the Word of God every week together. That's cool. Out of those, we have 40 INB's (Involved New Believers), which means that these students not only made a decision for Jesus but are currently active in the movement. This might be my favorite statistic too! We've also seen 150 freshmen get involved this year. There are 9 students doing full-time ministry this coming year out of the movement. And this summer we are sending students around the world on short term missions projects. Praise God for what He is doing, but please continue to pray that God would do even more!

➔ Over spring break we went on a short mission trip with 49 UW-Madison students to Panama City Beach (PCB.) The trip is called "Big Break." And it is big!!! On the other side I've included a page just on Big Break stories. It was amazing. It was one of the best things that we've done in a while... you'll see!

One fellow staff met a popular frat guy who had everything he wanted. When the staff member said, "What if God asked you, 'Why should I let you into heaven?' what would you say?" His response was, "I think I could talk God into letting me in..." Politely challenging the answer, the staff read and discussed the parable of "the rich young ruler" and how the story related to the gospel. Afterward, the student soberly said, "What's it like to look into the eyes of someone's life you just changed?"



Mike had a very meaningful conversation with a guy about the gospel in the parking lot of *Spinnakers*, which is a huge, crowded club on the beach; and afterwards he asked Mike, "Can I take a picture of us together, because I don't ever want to forget this night."
