

What Can Badgers Do For Haiti?

Help. That is what Badgers can do. This past Saturday we hosted "Badgers Helping Haiti" as an effort to do our part to provide relief for those suffering in Haiti.

Teams of students in our ministry got behind this effort



headed by the "Outreach" team and the "Community" team. These students gave of their time and energy and raised funds and supplies to make relief kits for Haiti.

Currently in Haiti the death toll is rising due to disease, sickness, and infection. In fact, news reports are saying that outbreak of disease could possibly kill more people than the actual destruction caused by the massive earthquake itself.

Because of this we put together 600 hygiene kits. While 600 hygiene kits is just a drop in the bucket in Haiti, 600 hundred kits will bring some welcome relief to 600 people (and their families.) 600 hundred people will be able to wash their hands and clothes and hair and fight against disease and infection. And quite simply 600 kits is at least a drop in the bucket... and many drops will fill the bucket.


